



Lutheran Mobile Warming Station in Rapid City.





#### COUNCIL MINUTES — December 20, 2022

#### Pastor's Report:

- Wrapped up first semester of confirmation.
   There were 28 7, 8 & 9 graders
- Working on summer camps
- Working on new outdoor sign
- January will be stewardship month
- Presented the 2023 Noisy Offering Schedule (same as 2022)

#### **Deacon's Report:**

- Shared in presiding and music for worship services
- Learning about rotation of weekly chapel at 5 care facilities
- Plans to begin Grief Group on January 23
- Installation on Sunday, February 5
- Reviewing Milestones

#### **Ministry Reports:**

- Worship: Worship volunteer sign-up has been good.
   Christmas services planned.
- Fellowship & Caring: Prayer and Care team met two weeks ago. Visitation list is being updated.
- Faith Formation: First semester of 'Journey with Jesus' is finished. 55 kids took part in the Christmas Program on Sunday, December 18. Many volunteers mad this happen. 'Journey with Jesus' will resume on January 11 with the study of Moses.
- Stewardship: Rick will give a temple talk on January 8 to include scholarship deadline, pitch for volunteers for the Valentine's Cookie Sale, and the upcoming Pledge Drive.
- Property: Water leak in the upstairs daycare bathroom. Krohmer replaced some ceiling tiles in the lower bathroom. Daycare
  dishwasher backed up. Benders will come to check it out. Jon showed samples of the carpet in the downstairs.
- Memorial Committee: John reported for Jeff Clark who will be going off the memorial committee. Barb Vandever, Ron Kogel, and Michelle White are the members of this committee. Four areas that have been contributed to: scholarships, chapel refresh, TV & tables for the youth and 3rd grade bibles. Future possibilities: carpeting in the Family Life Center, outdoor signage and Paul Oman's 'Drawn to the Word'.

**Reception of the Treasurer's Report:** November 2022 income \$28,241.87; expenses \$19,964.32. Net gain for November \$8,277.55. YTD 2022 Income \$92,431.41. Jon made a motion to receive the Treasurer's report, seconded by Scott. Motion carried.

#### **New Business:**

- Credit Cards: Karen made a motion, seconded by Rick to issue credit cards to Pastor Scott and Deacon Kris.
   Motion approved.
- Review FLC 2023 Budget: Eric handed out the draft of the 2023 budget and asked for questions or input. Wayne made a

#### PASTOR SCOTT

#### We Are an Offering . . .

As we turn the calendar page to a new year, we will be taking the month of January to intentionally focus on stewardship.

This year's stewardship theme comes from the offertory hymn that we sing most weeks in worship. It's hymn #692 in our Evangelical Lutheran Worship hymnal, We Are an Offering.

The hymn was composed by Dwight Liles, and along with the beautiful melody, are insightful lyrics about stewardship.

We tend to first think of our financial support to the church when we talk about stewardship. But the hymn never specifically mentions money. Instead it has a more comprehensive (and biblical) approach that reminds us our whole lives are about stewardship.

The hymn consists of only four lines. The first (and last) line of the hymn is about our offerings . . . specifically we lift our voices, we lift our hands, and we lift our lives up to God as an offering. In the second line we make a request of God. We request that God *use* our voices, that God *use* our hands, and that God *use* our lives.

The third line of the song is this beautiful confession of faith. Together we sing,



## All that we have, all that we are, all they we hope to be, we give to you, we give to you.

This comprehensive approach to stewardship also aligns with our congregation's mission statement developed this past year. That statement is: *Connecting faith and daily life.* When we live with that hope, our lives do take on greater inspiration and meaning as we love and serve our neighbors as an act of stewardship in our lives of faith.

In the first part of January, congregation members will receive a stewardship letter and commitment card in the mail. We ask that members prayerfully consider how they might support the ministry of First Lutheran in the upcoming year.

On January 29th, we will have an in-gathering of our stewardship commitment cards as part of our Celebration Sunday worship service.

Thank you for all the ways you have supported the ministry of First Lutheran Church and the work of its' staff this past year. I'm looking forward to a fruitful year of ministry with Deacon Kris joining our team and expanding our ministry work in the congregation and the community.



The following items are included in each Personal Care Kit:

- ⇒ One light-weight bath-size towel (20" x 40" to 52" x 27") dark color recommended
- ⇒ Two to three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz, any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars
- ⇒ One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging
- ⇒ One sturdy comb (no picks or fine tooth combs), remove packaging
- ⇒ One metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging

When you know that a church member is hospitalized, has been moved to a nursing home, or has become homebound, please contact the church.

At the hospital front desk Pastor Scott or Deacon Kris can ask for and review the Lutheran list. Our hospitalized church members are usually on that list. Sometimes they are not because of a mistake: the hospital forgot to ask the name of the patient's home church, or (for one reason or another) it just didn't get on the list. So we'd rather hear ten times from you about someone in need of a visit rather than to hear nothing at all. We are a church family. Your visits to members of this congregation's family are important, as well. And keeping the pastor informed is also part of your ministry as a member of the congregation. Thank you!
